A MATURING SYMPHONY

Guest conductor Gisele Ben-Dor and pianist Alan Gampel headline exceptional Classical Series concert

Guest conductor Gisele Ben-Dor isn't just anybody. Music director of the Santa Barbara Symphony in California and a frequent guest conductor everywhere from New York to London, she is one of the most heralded young conductors today. Yet, in Friday's Classical Series performance at DeVos Hall, there were a number of moments in which it appeared the players were a step ahead of the conductor, moving into new territory while Ben-Dor was keeping time.

However they got there, they got there in an exceptional Classical Series concert, featuring piano soloist Alan Gampel, who was in town for a weeklong residency that included a solo piano recital Tuesday at St. Cecilia Music Society.

Gampel, the 1995 Chopin Prize winner in the Arthur Rubinstein International Piano Competition in Israel, appeared in a mesmerizing performance of Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 3 in C minor.

The three-movement piano concerto hints provocatively at the progression of the composer's three-period career, from the traditional, classical opener, to the early romantic yet mature second movement, to the adventurous finale pointing the way to Beethoven's final works yet to come.

Gampel's playing could be both stormy and gentle, often happening simultaneously in opposing hands.

Yet, with his graceful, fluid legato technique and trills to die for, Gampel made one forget that the piano is a percussion instrument.
